

PDID-MITR
U.S. INTERNATIONAL TRAFFIC AND ARMS REGULATIONS
(ITAR)

The purpose of this PDID is to obtain information from the Seller regarding the use of non-U.S. citizens in the performance of any subcontract resulting from this solicitation.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Provide the following information:

1. Does the Seller currently employ any non-U.S. citizens? If so how many and what are their job functions?
2. Does the Seller intend to utilize any non-U.S. citizens in the performance of any subcontract resulting from this solicitation?
3. If the answer to 2) above is yes, What are the employee's names, country of citizenship and does the Seller currently have the proper valid documents (Green Card.) that allow these individuals to handle technical data?
4. Does the Seller intend to utilize any non-U.S. subcontractors? If so, please list the subcontractor's name, point of contact's name and phone number, and complete address.
5. If the answer to 4 above is yes, the Seller shall provide a copy of the valid TAA or export license and any other associated Department of State required forms (such as DSP-5, Permanent Export License, DSP-73, Temporary Export, etc) currently on file with the U. S. Department of State to discuss/transfer technical data with this foreign company.
6. Seller is further advised that if it engages in the United States in the business of either manufacturing or exporting defense articles as defined in ITAR 120.6 or defense services as defined in ITAR 120.9, then Seller is required by the ITAR, Part 122 to register with the US Department of State, Office of Defense Trade Controls (DTC) using forms accessible at the DTC web site at www.pmdtc.org. Manufacturers of defense articles who do not engage in exporting of same must nevertheless register with the DTC. Registration by itself does not confer export rights or privileges, but is generally a precondition to the issuance of any license or other approval by DTC. Seller DDTC Registration Code _____.
